Through our Congressional Educational Achievement Gap Community Project sponsored by Congressman Jamal Bowman's Office, we partnered with Stress Less Kids L.C.C. to have three pyschologist train students in evidence based tools to cope with stress. Kids were "tapping" to help themselves regulate their feelings of stress, excessive tiredness, or anger. It was amazing! They were implementing the skills from this program, applying it in real-time and it was making a difference. We've even heard parents share

funny stories of how their child was providing strategies to help them, the parent, calm down at home. Truth is, especially after the pandemic, these techniques have proven to be an invaluable tool. We are grateful that so many families opted to take advantage of this free program and that it is having such a positive and life changing impact. 

We ended the year with a special trip to the Bartow Pell-Manor Museum. Through the efforts of Ms. Heidi, our in-house STEM/Arts specialist, the Kidz Club students had their art work displayed in the actual museum. Impressive! Working with students, Ms. Heidi centered the art work around things that soar. Students created ornaments of planes, superheroes, skyscrapers, and birds to name just a few, that are currently on display in the second floor bedroom. During our afternoon excursion to the museum, we also had the opportunity to tour the home. We noticed the bedrooms of the estate owners and how that contrasted to the sleeping quarters for the servants. We observed that bathrooms did not have toilets in how we know them today; they had bowls that had to be cleaned up. The scariest observation, however, was that they did not have any television sets or computers. Although our intent was to see the art work, students gained a great deal more, especially an appreciation for modern conveniences.

We have much to celebrate but we are most appreciative of our kids. We are grateful to you for entrusting your child with us. We take this responsibility to heart and strive to provide the best for them. Towards that end, we will continue to seek opportunities to expose our children to new experiences. In the upcoming weeks, we will have additional staff members to support tutoring for students struggling in school. New dance classes will begin in January. Stress Less for Kids will have one more session starting at the end of January. Our holiday camps in February and April will include trips to

Congressman Jamal Bowman's Office. The YMCA will provide a highly effective and hugely praised program called Stress Less Kids TM. This is a mindfulness program to teach school-aged children coping skills to deal with anxiety and pressure, enabling them to achieve healthier social relationships and greater academic achievement. Integrating evidence based tools, the program reaches children early enough to have a significant impact on their ability to navigate the pressures they face with greater confidence and success. This program will speak directly to alleviating the pandemic-related turmoil and attendant stresses and anxieties, that our children have experienced these past two years. Based on the feedback from students and families who completed the first session, we highly recommend this program as it teaches life-long and invaluable tools.

During our meeting, we will introduce the founders of the program, learn more about the philosophy, children successes, and how it can benefit not only *your* child, but everyone.

REGISTRATION OPEN for UPK Program 2023

The New Rochelle YMCA is honored to partner with the City School District of New Rochelle's Universal Pre-K program and provide our community with an outstanding educational foundation. New Rochelle residents can choose to have their child enrolled through the New Rochelle Board of Education; if they are selected in the district-wide lottery, the 2.5 hour Pre-K program is free. 
FOOD PANTRY
